Modeled after college savings accounts, ABLE accounts allow individuals with qualifying disabilities and their families to save for a wide range of disability-related expenses. These federal tax-free savings and investment options are offered to encourage individuals with a disability and their families to save private funds to support health, independence, and quality of life while maintaining government benefits.

Cathy Grow, Transition Coordinator, developed and oversees the Defenders' Café at Warrior Run High School in Norhtumberland County, PA. Join us as she shares about Warrior Run School District's comprehensive transition program, Warrior Run Internship Network (WIN), and the inception of Defenders' Café, a vocational training program for students in autistic and life skills supports classes, while focusing on the employability of all students, regardless of the severity of their disability.
